

Ramon is located in the north central region of Zamboanga Peninsula. Its municipal seat of power is located at coordinates $8^{\circ} 0' 24''$ north latitude and $123^{\circ} 29' 8''$ East longitude.

Political Boundaries

Ramon Magsaysay is bounded in the north by municipality of Molave, north-east by municipality of Tambulig, south-east by municipality of Aurora, south southwest by municipality of Tukuran and west northwest by municipality of Sominot.




Figure 1. Map of Ramon Magsaysay in Zamboanga Peninsula




Figure 2. Administrative Map of Ramon Magsaysay

2. Demographic Background:

Demographic data provide essential means for the development and evaluation of policies. Data collected from this category are useful for building and updating registries, and identifying certain groups in a locality.

About 62.97% (17,789) of the population is of working age (15 to 64 years old) while young dependents (under 15 years old) make up 29.74% (8,401) of the total, and elderly dependents (65 years old and over) make up 7.29% (2,060). Because of this, the working population is under some stress due to the dependency ratio, which is 58.81%.

With regards to the data on children, about 17.07% (4,821) of the population is female and 18.91% (5,341) is male.

2. The Overview of the Peace and Order and Public Safety (POPS) Situation in the LGU

1. Peace and Order

The peace and order situation in the municipality for 2024 remained generally stable and manageable. Based on data from the Philippine National Police (PNP), a total of 62 crimes were recorded, comprising 8 index crimes and 15 non-index crimes. The crime solution efficiency was high at 95.16%, while crime clearance efficiency reached 100%, indicating effective law enforcement operations and case resolutions.

The municipality maintains a ratio of one (1) police personnel for every 682 residents, with one police outpost serving the locality. There were no reported human rights violations, election-related violent incidents, or new cases of children in conflict with the law for the year, reflecting strong community cooperation and effective peacekeeping measures.

2. Illegal Drugs

In compliance with Republic Act No. 9165, the municipality continued its anti-illegal drugs campaign in coordination with the PNP and the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC). For 2024, there were 663 identified Persons Who Use Drugs (PWUDs). However, there were no reported drug-affected barangays or drug-clearing operations during the period. The PNP conducted nine (9) buy-bust operations, resulting in several arrests and the disruption of illegal drug activities.

Rehabilitation efforts were supported through the Rural Health Unit (RHU), which catered to 27 PWUDs under general intervention programs. Additionally, one (1) partnership was established with a CSO/NGO/PO to support aftercare and reintegration programs for drug dependents.

3. Conflict Situation

The municipality remained free from armed conflict and insurgency-related incidents throughout 2024. There were no reports of violent incidents involving armed groups, ethnic or resource-based conflicts, or community displacement due to conflict. The ratio of police and military personnel to the population remained at 1:682, and one police station was present in the area to maintain peace and security.

There were also no recorded violations involving Indigenous Peoples (IPs) or children affected by armed conflict. However, one (1) case of gender-based violence involving acts of lasciviousness was reported and is being monitored by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWD) in coordination with the PNP.

4. Public Safety

In terms of road and vehicle safety, the PNP recorded 39 road accidents during the year. Continuous efforts are being made to install traffic warning signage and CCTV systems in strategic areas to enhance surveillance and accident prevention.

Under emergency and crisis management, the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) reported a total of nine (9) fire incidents—six (6) caused by natural factors and three (3) structural fires. The BFP continues to strengthen its fire prevention campaigns and improve emergency response mechanisms.

Conclusion

Overall, the municipality maintained a generally peaceful and orderly environment throughout 2024. The strong partnership among the PNP, BFP, AFP, MSWD, RHU, and civil society organizations contributed significantly to sustaining peace, promoting public safety, and addressing issues on illegal drugs and violence. Continuous enhancement of police visibility, community awareness, and rehabilitation programs are recommended to further improve the municipality's peace and order situation in the succeeding years.

WHEREAS, after due deliberation of the presented POPS Plan 2026-2028, the MPOC Members considered for its approval;


